CHURCH SERVICES AT CHRISTMAS

- On Christmas Eve, 245 people viewed, 111 machines looking only at St Mary's. 65 of these were in the UK, 21 in Ireland, 17 in the USA, and 6 elsewhere. 139 probably stayed on-line long enough to take part in Mass.
- On Christmas Day, 132 people viewed, 29 machines looking only at St Mary's. 15 of these were in the UK, 11 in the USA and 3 elsewhere. 104 probably stayed on-line long enough to take part in Mass.
- On Sunday 1st January 2023, 153 people viewed, 48 machines looking only at St Mary's. 24 of these were in the UK, 19 in the USA, and 4 elsewhere. 110 probably stayed on-line long enough to take part in Mass.

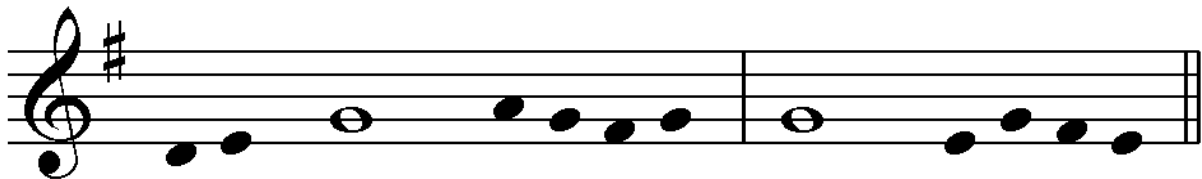
