Every Sunday is a Holy Day of Obligation, and this year, so are the following:

Thurs. 29th May – The Ascension Fri. 15th August – The Assumption Thurs. 25th December Christmas Day

Liturgical Living

The Church's Liturgy, and her cycle of feasts and fasts, is the primary way for Catholics to engage with the mysteries of Our Lord's life, death, and resurrection, and with the Church's own history. Why not choose this year to live liturgically, perhaps making time to attend another Mass, or to celebrate the seasonal cycle at home with food, prayer, and acts of charity?

The calendar above gives just a few important dates: why not celebrate the feasts of your patron saint(s), or those which fall on particularly special days for you?

Quarterly Quodlibets

Four quarterly opportunities to ask (and perhaps have answered), debate, and explore questions of faith (and anything else) with our Anglican brothers & sisters (and other interested parties). Vaguely in the style of the medieval disputation of the same name, come and ask 'quodlibet' a lovely Latin word which means, more-or-less, 'whatever you like'.
