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#### The Litany of Loreto

The Litany of Our Lady (known as the Litany 'of Loreto' after the shrine in Italy where it is first recorded in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century) is a catena, or chain, of beautiful titles for Mary, God's Mother and ours. There are 53 titles under which she is petitioned in the Litany, so reflections are provided in the five weeks of May on only some of them.

## Sancta Dei Genitrix | Holy Mother of God

This is the first of Mary's titles in the Litany, and the most important: only if this is true are we really saved. But the phrase is shocking in its boldness - how can anyone be the Mother of God? In the early Church, heretics wished to say instead "Mother of Christ," thus dividing Jesus the man from the Second Person of the Holy Trinity. To do this, however, is to deny the reality of the Incarnation, the completeness with which Jesus "emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men." (Phil 2:7). Of course, we do not believe Mary to be the Mother of Creator of Jesus' divinity; that would be blasphemous. But to say only "Mother of Christ" is to imply that Christ's humanity was something casually taken up, to be (perhaps) laid aside again later, and moreover, that the being Who suffered on the Cross was the man Jesus, rather than the God-man Jesus Christ, the Son of God. We should murmur this phrase with holy awe at the great paradox, that God has so completely and permanently entered into His own creation as to allow us to call Mary, in perfect truth, "Mother of God."

# Mater Christi | Mother of Christ

And yet it is perfectly true to say that Mary is the Mother of Christ, the "Anointed One," for that is Who Jesus is: the Messiah, the anointed prophet, priest, and king of Israel. This title situates Mary as the great flower of Israel, the culmination of God's loving shepherding of His chosen race, the Jews. As prophets (cf. Ps. 105:15), priests (Ex. 40:15), and kings (1 Sam. 16:13) were anointed with oil in the Old Testament, so Jesus received the anointing of the Holy Spirit in His baptism, to be our prophet, our great High Priest, and our king.

#### Mater Divinæ Gratiæ | Mother of Divine Grace

When the angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will "conceive, and bear a son" (Luke 1:31) he hails her as "full of grace." Grace, from the Latin gratia, translating the Greek charis, means, literally, 'gift', something freely given, unmerited, a favour. Mary was full of gifts from God in the sense of being preserved from original sin, from committing actual sins, and adorned with virtues to fit her for her God-earing place in the economy of salvation. But she was about to become even more 'full of grace' in that she was to contain the Lord of the Universe, to hold the Son of God in her womb – "heaven and earth in a little space" as the famous mediæval lyric puts it. Jesus Christ in the Incarnation gives Mary – and all mankind – the greatest 'gift' of all: Himself. 'Mother of the divine gift' then, we hail her, and ask her for yet one more gift, her prayers, which will be heard on account of that great gift once given, her son Jesus Christ.

## Mater Boni Consilii | Mother of Good Counsel

In the Augustinian church at Genazzano, near Rome, there is a small fresco of the Virgin and Child which is known as 'Mother of Good Counsel', devotion to which was widespread on account of its reportedly miraculous appearance. Even today, you will find reproductions or renderings of it in many places. The origins of the title are only slightly less obscure than the origins of the miraculous image, but we might find a clue in the Wedding at Cana, when Our Lady gives perhaps the best counsel ever given by one human to another: "do whatever He tells you" (John 2:5). Under this title invoke the Blessed Virgin's prayers when making difficult decisions or discerning God's call – what it is that God is telling you to do.

#### Mater Creatoris | Mother of the Creator

There is a wonderful paradox contained in these two words which contains the whole marvel of the Incarnation: Mother of the Maker, Maker of the Maker. Such is the humility of God, to allow His own Creation to be called His Mother, and that – as we have seen – truly. How blessed is human childbearing now that God Himself has deigned to be born of a woman. He Who fashions us in the womb (139:13), was Himself fashioned in the womb of the Blessed Virgin, and was made man.
