THE CHRISTMAS OBLIGATION

All Catholics are bound to hear Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation, if it is *possible* (not 'convenient') for them to do so. To miss Mass on a Sunday or Day of Obligation when one might have gone is a grave sin which should be confessed before receiving Holy Communion.

THIS YEAR, Christmas falls on a Monday, which means we have two obligations back-to-back: **first**, to hear Mass on **SUNDAY** 24th, and **second**, to hear Mass on **CHRISTMAS DAY**, 25th. We can fulfil these obligations in number of ways, but we *must* do so at separate masses.

The Sunday obligation can be fulfilled at mass from 4pm on Saturday 23rd until midnight on Sunday 24th, regardless of whether this is a Mass of the Sunday or not. The Christmas obligation can be fulfilled from 4pm on Sunday 24th until midnight on Christmas Day (this Mass will inevitably be a Mass of Christmas). But they must be two distinct masses!

Remember: the Church obliges us to hear Mass on certain days because it's good for us, and because she wants us to go to heaven!

THE FOUR LAST THINGS

Traditionally, in Advent, Catholics meditate on the Four Last Things: DEATH, JUDGEMENT, HEAVEN, and HELL. Today: Judgment

JUDGEMENT

"When the Son of man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats?" Matt. 25:31-33

"Who am I to judge" has become something of a commonplace in the Church these days, but there is One for Whom the answer is "The Son of Man," "the judge of all the earth" (Gen. 18:25). That we, in our ignorance, should refrain from judging the eternal fate of others is right and proper, but this does not mean there will be no Judgment at all.

Our judgments are bound to be mistaken, in whole or in part, because we see so little. Christ, Who knows the secrets of our hearts, cannot err, and so His judgment will be true, a manifestation of *perfect* justice.

How shall we be judged? "the hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear his voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment [/condemnation]." (John 5:28-29). Is this 'works religion'? No, because only Faith gives rise to works which are meritorious (that is, deserving reward), and that only because the faithful are united to Christ, to Whom all merit belongs.

In judging us, then, Christ judges not what we have done of ourselves, but how far we have allowed Him to work *in* and *through* us, how far we have cooperated with His grace working in us. As S. Augustine wrote, "He crowns you because He crowns His own gifts, not your merits."

These gifts are given us through the Mercy of God. In strict *justice*, we all deserve condemnation. But ours is a *merciful* God, Who gave His only Son out of love for us, and so saves us whilst remaining *both* just *and* merciful. Praise be to Him for His merciful justice!

"Mercy and truth are met together. Righteousness and peace have kissed each other" Ps. 84:11[85:10]
